U-11 Girls: **Blue:** training, improving spacing; great things happening; commitment issues; Novi Champions

**White:** going to Beaver Creek; struggling; progressing though

U-11 Boys: **White:** Division II; improving; struggling with upper division and aggressiveness of other teams; passing improved; impressive lateral movement; going to Beaver Creek

**Blue:** playing together as a team well; getting concept of game; going to Beaver Creek; majority of team is coming back.

U-12 Girls: **Blue:** distractions with other activities; good group of kids; Division II; working on keeping possession of ball and look for teammate; attacking improved; weak on striking ball to other team; lacking enthusiasm on field.

U-12 Boys: **White:** Division I; struggling; moving ball and speed of play; looking for opportunities; seeing benefits; attended BGSU and Mansfield tournaments

**Blue:** Division II at BG Tournament; played well; working together as a team; thinking about positions; sometimes slow and not in game; work on foot skills; first touches; good season.

U-13 Girls: played in NWOH U14/15 Division II, size of girls are different as well as age; better passing the ball; spacing and competition; support each other

Team Reports:

U-13 Boys: finishing season; record doesn't show abilities; attended BG Tournament and made to semifinals; need to find the net; goals were set; need to prepare to come to practice and play; losing seems to motivate; work well on passing; better soccer with pressure; flexibility of positions for players.

U-14 Girls: Division I focus; improved in some areas; need improvement in tactics; commitment issues and distractions; going to Beaver Creek

U-14 Boys: no goalkeeper; state league; strong core; playing with 12 players
